Personal Viewpoint

The spectacular position of The Atlantis Historic Inn on Barbados' east coast blew us away, figuratively speaking! The breezes here are certainly constant, but cooling and delightful.

The oversized rooms are seriously romantic – imagine throwing open your bedroom shutters to the wild Atlantic Ocean waves, slipping back into the luxury of your four poster bed and watching the sun rise in the Caribbean – this is the place to do it.

The hotel is family run by very hands-on owners who understand the meaning of unpretentious luxury, this delightful escape is the hotel to spend a few days relaxing, perfect to combine with a west coast hotel or resort property. There's also a great restaurant again with views to die for.









How to get there

Direct flights with British Airways from London Heathrow and London Gatwick. Direct flights with Virgin Atlantic from London Heathrow, Manchester and Edinburgh. Direct flights with Aer Lingus from Manchester. Convenient European connections via Amsterdam with KLM or via Frankfurt with Condor.

Location

On Tent Bay, St Joseph at Bathsheba on the east coast of Barbados, with a transfer time from the airport of approx. 40 mins and just a 30 minute drive through lovely countryside from the busier and better known west coast of the island. The capital Bridgetown is 40 minutes' drive away.

Accommodation

7 spacious bedrooms in the main house overlooking the ocean and 2 two-bedroom cottage suites next to the pool. Government Room Levy of US\$4.38 per Bedroom per night is payable locally.

Airport Transfers

One way taxi journey from the airport is US\$50 (with standard luggage) and US\$65 (with excess luggage) for 2 persons. These can be arranged via the hotel.

• Fast Track at Barbados Airport: US\$60 per person aged 12 and over. Under 12 is free of charge. Must be booked at least 48 hours prior to arrival and can be booked directly through the hotel.

Beaches

Whilst located right on the beach, swimming is not recommended in the area as there is always a strong rip current.

Check-in/Check-out

Check-in is 3:00pm. Check-out is 12:00noon.

Pre-Arrival Groceries

Guests can send through a grocery list up to 72 hours before arrival and the items will be placed in their suite prior to check-in. The first grocery order delivery is complimentary, and any additional orders or orders received less than 72 hours prior to arrival will be subject to a US\$25 delivery fee. Grocery orders must be a minimum of US\$50 to be accepted by the supermarket.

Children

Are welcome, but children under 12 years can only be accommodated in the second bedroom of a 2-bedroom suite throughout the year.

Climate

Delightful year-round. Average temperate 27°C (84°F) with the dry season mid-December – May.

Credit Cards

The hotel accepts MasterCard and Visa only. There is a 2% tax added onto hotel bills when paying by credit, debit and travel cards.

Currency

Barbados dollar (tied to the US dollar). US dollars are readily acceptable and the office and the hotel is able to change limited amounts of foreign currency.

Dress Code

Casual is the order of the day, with cover-ups worn when going to and from the pool and the beach. Swimwear is not permitted in the restaurant. Evening attire in the restaurant is elegantly casual.

Drivers Licence

A temporary driver's permit can be obtained on presentation of a full and valid UK driving licence – cost BD\$10.

Electricity

110volts/50 cycles.

Hotel & Sports Facilities

Fresh water swimming pool (open 24hrs a day). The Atlantis Restaurant and bar, upstairs lounge with books, business services via the hotel office. Refurbished communal guest lounge and kitchen in the main house.

Meals and Drinks

At the world renowned restaurant, which overlooks the Atlantic Ocean. Barbadian buffet lunch offered Sundays.

- Breakfast: 8.00am 10.00am.
- A La Carte Lunch: Tuesday and Thursday 12.00pm 3:30pm.
- All Day A La Carte Dining Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday 12.00pm 7.00pm (extended to 8pm between 15 December - 28 February)
- Buffet Lunch Sundays: 12.00pm 3:30pm

On Tuesday, Wednesday and Sunday a special menu will be available for guests to pre-order meals for dinner which will be delivered to their suites. They can then dine in the private guest lounge downstairs on their own schedule

Room Service available for all meals except buffets.

Other restaurants: The Fish Pot on the Northwest coast is a sister restaurant to the Atlantis and is very popular with locals and visitors alike – well worth a trip for lunch or dinner.

The Round House and Dina's are located in the next bay, just a minute's walk from the hotel.

Room service: Breakfast, lunch and dinner (except Sunday Buffet) is available from the restaurant menu daily until 8.00pm.

Number of Rooms and Suites: 9

The 7 double rooms in the main house are on the first floor are directly facing the Atlantic Ocean with fabulous views of the beach and the surf. The 2 two-bedroom cottage suites are located by the pool.

Facilities: All bedrooms are air-conditioned with individual controls, plus ceiling fans, private shower, bathrobes and amenities. All accommodations have cable TV, iPod docking, radio, mini fridge, keyed mini-safe, iron and ironing board, hairdryer and tea and coffee making facilities.

All Rooms have IPTV with access to over 2400 channels around the world including 200 U.K. Channels.

1-Bedroom Coastal View Room

(Quantity: 3)

These rooms consist of a spacious four poster king size bed and sitting area, located in the main building overlooking the ocean. These rooms have coastal views but direct ocean views are not guaranteed.

Room names are as follows: Conset Bay, Skeet's Bay and Cattlewash

Note: some rooms are slightly larger with a pull out sofa bed and an extra person is allowed on request only. Maximum occupancy: 2 persons.





1-Bedroom Oceanfront Rooms

(Quantity: 4)

These rooms offer gorgeous direct views of the stunning ocean from the king size four poster bed. Ideal for couples. Room names are as follows: Three Boys, Soup Bowl, Martin's Bay and Glenbernie

Note: some rooms are slightly larger with a pull out sofa bed and an extra person is allowed on request only. Maximum occupancy: 2 persons.





2-Bedroom Oceanview Cottage

(Quantity: 2)

There are two self-contained 2 bedroom apartments next to the pool, ideal for families. The master bedroom has a Queen bed and the second bedroom has twin beds, each with a shared bathroom. These cottages are perfect for couples or families travelling together.

Facilities include: a full kitchen, dining and living area.

The two suites are named the Upper Cappernum and the Lower Cappernum.

Maximum occupancy: 4 persons.





Buy-Out Option: The Main House

(Rooms: 7)

Guests have the option of buying out the entire Main House of all 1-Bedroom Coastal View and 1-Bedroom Oceanfront rooms, with a maximum occupancy of 14 guests. Guests will have exclusive use of the guest lounge and kitchen.

Maximum occupancy: 14 persons.









The Atlantis Historic Inn can arrange weddings for guests at the property which has a stunning oceanfront position with constant cooling breezes – a truly magnificent backdrop to your wedding.

The hotel offers the services of a Wedding co-ordinator who will help plan everything, whether it's a simple beach wedding or a lavish sit down meal and ceremony.

They will pass on the charges for the licence fees which total approx. US\$200 plus extras such as photography, flowers etc. These costs will be payable locally.

Legal Requirements:

There is no official waiting period prior to the wedding ceremony. Couples must first go to the Ministry of Legal Affairs to obtain their marriage licence and the marriage can then take place (The Ministry is closed on Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays). A letter will be obtained from the Marriage Officer saying that he will perform the wedding service.

The following documents are required:

- Valid passports
- If divorced, the original Decree Absolute papers must be produced
- If widowed, the Marriage Certificate and partner's Death Certificate must be produced, unless the Death Certificate carries the name of the surviving partner
- If under 18 years of age, he or she must be accompanied by a parent
- If above documents are not in English, an official translation of these in English, must accompany the originals

Church Weddings

Weddings in church can be arranged at an additional charge. However, if guests request a Catholic wedding, 2 or 3 months' notice will be required as it is necessary for documentation to be prepared by the local church.









A Day in the Life of a Guest at The Atlantis Historic Inn

Mount Gay is the oldest rum refinery in the world, so be sure not to leave the island without sampling some of this famous delicious rum!
